FOUL LANGUAGE

Flying Arrow Saddle Club strives to provide a fun, family-friendly environment. To that end, foul language is unacceptable. We have had several recent incidents involving foul language, including at least one instance of an adult directing such language at a child. This behavior is unacceptable and the Board reserves the right to take action against any adult behaving in such manner.

NAME CALLING

Every rider and every horse is welcome at Flying Arrow shows. Any language or behavior that indicates otherwise shows poor sportsmanship. Parents are expected to remind their children of this, and adults are expected to set a good example.

Attention all games riders!

In order to provide a safe environment, only responsible adults will be allowed to aid riders in getting into the arena, and only on foot. No ponying of horses, and no kids helping other kids. Either get help from an adult, or lead the horse into the arena and mount after the gate is closed. No children on foot should be in the gate area during games.

Please pick up after yourselves during and
after shows. Trash cans are available on
the grounds. Make them feel useful!*

Please remember that when a class is over, showing etiquette requires that all entries in a class remain in the ring until the class winners have exited. The only exceptions are when riders have a tack change. The gate person should be alerted to tack changes when the class enters the ring.

Remember that in order to be eligible for year-end awards, each individual member must complete 4 hours of volunteer work; families must complete six hours. Write down your hours in the notebook at the entry booth.
